





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
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INVISIBLE WOUNDS

Intergenerational Trauma


The transmission and impact of trauma across generations via stress reactions, attitudes, beliefs, and other conscious and unconscious actions by caregivers.

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Historical Trauma

The cumulative emotional and psychological wounding of an individual or generation caused by a traumatic experience or event.



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SURVIVING THE DISCONNECT FROM THE SOCIAL CONTRACT

Survival Mode: Flight/Fight/Freeze

Frontal lobe (Prefrontal cortex) goes offline Limbic system / mind and lower brain functions take over




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REBUILDING THE CONNECTION WITH 3 A'S

 Addressing health disparities and disproportionate service engagement requires tackling the presence and impact of multiple forms of trauma on marginalized communities.

Three A's for passing on justice in clinical service delivery.

Acknowledge the role of trauma in increasing disparities and resilience among communities. Ask questions and collect data about the impact of trauma and best practices for promoting health. Adjust service design and delivery to reflect the culture of communities being served.
